



The Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) is the framework adopted by the EU for a common, unified agricultural policy for all EU countries. Its formation and management are carried out at the European level and its financing comes from EU budget resources.

The CAP was established in 1962 and is constantly evolving to respond to changing economic conditions and the demands/needs of producers and consumers. The new CAP 2023-27 entered into force on 1 January 2023.




